Resident Profile - Xavier Morris

We're going to miss Providence Home resident **Xavier Morris.** But it's clear God has him on the move, and so we rejoice in this *good* goodbye.

Characterized by exceedingly good cheer, gratitude, and optimism, Xavier defies most of the presumed stereotypes of a man needing transitional housing.

Xavier came to us just six months ago. He had been a truck driver, earning great money and living in an upscale Columbia apartment complex.

Xavier thought he had it all. But he admits his confidence in his successful lifestyle caused him to take his health for granted.

Life on the road featuring frequent truck stops and hasty meals took their toll. Xavier's weight exploded and along with it, his blood pressure. His sleep apnea worsened with his other health issues, so it shouldn't have been a surprise when he failed a routine Department of Transportation health test.

Since sleep and general good health are paramount to long-distance driving, Xavier lost his job, his income, and soon his nice apartment.

And just like that, Xavier Morris found himself homeless.

He admits to occasionally using alcohol as a crutch during those dark days, and with his family in Ohio, Xavier couldn't afford to move home or buy meds. And so, instead of driving a truck to make a good living, he lived in his car to survive.

This went on for about six months until, at another local mission, Xavier learned about Providence Home.



Xavier says he "heard on the street" that Providence Home offered men a clean, stable, and safe environment. After an interview with Program Director, **Mark Davis**, Xavier knew he found the help he needed.

And God began a great U-turn in his life.

Xavier secured a solid job as a forklift operator and hit the gym when he wasn't working or required to be on campus. He lost 25 pounds and found a new reliance on Jesus Christ. The next time he took that DOT test, he passed with flying colors – his weight and blood pressure normal and his sleep issues stabilized.

With a new license on life, Xavier applied to drive for one of the industry's top trucking lines. He got the job and as God would have it, he's based out of Ohio – back home.

Xavier's eyes fill with tears when he recounts what Providence Home has meant to him. "I owe a lot to the Providence Home. You gave me an environment where I could work on myself. I was surrounded by kindness and focused on scripture," he says. "The chapels opened me up to so much...it encourages me and blesses me to stay on the right path."

Or, in Xavier's case, on the right road.

It's beginning to look a lot like...chapel!

Thank You for Service to the Board - Edwin Davis


Our longtime and devoted board member, **Edwin Davis**, is rolling off our Providence Home Board of Directors after many years of service.
